Passover is April 5-13. Passover is a Jewish holiday that is celebrated in the early spring. It lasts for eights days and celebrates the freeing of the Israelites from slavery. Some people refrain from eating leavened grain. Seder is celebrated for the first two nights of Passover.

"The focal points of the Seder are:

Eating matzah.


Eating bitter herbs—to commemorate the bitter slavery endured by the Israelites. Drinking four cups of wine or grape juice—a royal drink to celebrate our newfound freedom. The recitation of the Haggadah, a liturgy that describes in detail the story of the Exodus from Egypt. The Haggadah is the fulfillment of the biblical obligation to recount to our children the story of the Exodus on the night of Passover. It begins with a child asking the traditional "Four Ouestions."
