We provide civil legal assistance—which does not include criminal or traffic matters—to lowincome individuals and older Coloradans throughout the state.

Pro bono attorneys are vital to our work to serve Coloradans. They handle hundreds of cases each year, allowing Colorado Legal Services attorneys to handle a greater number of complex cases. This month, we celebrate their contributions to our access to justice ecosystem.

TOP CASES OPENED



HOUSING

Colorado Legal Services opened 489 housing-related cases in September. These include eviction issues, landlord/tenant disputes, and other matters.



FAMILY AND SAFETY

Colorado Legal Services opened 233 family-related cases in September. These include domestic violence issues, divorce, and other matters.



CONSUMERS

Colorado Legal Services opened 117 consumer-related cases in September. These include helping people with bankruptcy, debt collection issues, and other matters.
