TOP CASES OPENED



HOUSING

Colorado Legal Services opened 396 housing-related cases in November. These include eviction issues, landlord/tenant disputes, and other matters.



FAMILY AND SAFETY

Colorado Legal Services opened 193 family-related cases in November. These include domestic violence issues, divorce, and other matters.



CONSUMERS

Colorado Legal Services opened 86 consumer-related cases in November. These include helping people with bankruptcy, debt collection issues, and other matters.
