WHO WE ARE

Colorado's statewide nonprofit legal aid program of committed public servants, including attorneys, paralegals, intake specialists, and administrative professionals, that has been serving Coloradans since 1925. We provide civil legal assistance—which does not include criminal or traffic matters—to low-income individuals and older Coloradans throughout the state.

THIS MONTH'S HIGHLIGHT

Preventing eviction

Colorado Legal Services works to help Coloradans avoid homelessness. One method is through eviction prevention webinars, which are presented by several Colorado Legal Services attorneys. The organization also staffs several eviction clinics in county courthouses, where attorneys and dedicated staff provide legal advice, assistance with drafting and filing documents with the court and in some cases represent tenants in court. Colorado Legal Services also runs an eviction diversion program in Pueblo and provides representation around the state.

TOP CASES OPENED



HOUSING

Colorado Legal Services opened 413 housing-related cases in December. These include eviction issues, landlord/tenant disputes, and other matters.



FAMILY AND SAFETY

Colorado Legal Services opened 141 family-related cases in December. These include domestic violence issues, divorce, and other matters.



CONSUMERS

Colorado Legal Services opened 112 consumer-related cases in December. These include helping people with bankruptcy, debt collection issues, and other matters.
